

### FROM FATHER PHONG

Everyday I feel a little stronger and the energy lasts a little longer. Yesterday I finally gathered enough courage to get into the Jeep and drove to the grocery store. The virus did spike every food morsel with a very pungent bitter taste. Now that my tastes and appetite have been returned I intend to embark on a serious vengeance. I love myself too much to lose even an ounce of fat to this dumb Covid!

Lent is here - an old English word meaning spring. Although every liturgical celebration and gesture throughout the season does speak of gloom, darkness and sin, Lent is a direct call to every Christian to walk only in the light of justice, inhale and exhale only the air of peace, and not only preach but practice forgiveness and compassion. "Remember that we are dust and unto dust we shall return" is the utmost primal cry and solemn credal declaration that we belong only to God. So, we must trek beyond all religious and political orientation, beyond all philosophical and cultural distinction, beyond all traditional or linguistic or customary conviction, beyond all skin colors, sexes, societal perches and economical statuses. Only then, when we finally are enlightened with the bare truth and the core meaningfulness of our existence - we are dust and unto dust we shall return - can we begin to live fully a human life and, therefore, a divine life.

Let us Christians, therefore, during this sacred season of Lent, stop being mean. Stop being unkind. Stop being stingy. Stop being egoistical. Stop being sexist. Stop being racist. Stop being lazy. Stop being judgmental. Stop being negative. Stop all the hates. Stop all the belittlings. Stop all the putting down of others. Stop looking down on anybody. And just stop being grouchy and difficult.

Be kind. Be forgiving. Be understanding. Be gentle. Be generous. Be positive. Be happy. Lend a hand to those who are in need. Reach out to the lonely. Comfort the brokenhearted. Dry the tears of the saddened. Each week buy a bag of non-perishable food for the hungry. Clean out the closets and put clothes on the naked and shoes on the barefooted. Come to the daily Mass and the Friday Stations. Read and reflect on the daily Scripture Reading. Say the morning and evening prayers. Go to Confession. And at least three times a day, say "I love you."

On behalf of the Church of Saint Clement, I would like to express profound words of gratitude to Sarah Xinh Nguyen who had been a tremendous assistance during the last few months at the office. Her gentle spirit, a dedicated heart and a superb professionalism did make the changes at the parish easy and smooth.

Ash Wednesday is this week, February **17**. Mass will be at 7:00 AM, Noon and 7:00 PM. Instead of marking the Sign of the Cross on the penitent's forehead, ashes will be sprinkled on the top of each person's head. Just bow your head and allow this beautiful Lenten symbol to start our inward journey to God. (Collection will benefit Catholic Charities.)

**Stations of the Cross** in English will begin at 6:00 PM every Lenten Friday. The Vietnamese Stations will begin right after the Friday evening Mass.

Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession will be at the usual weekend designations and by appointment. Communal Celebrations of the Sacrament will be announced once we gather enough help.

**Passion Sunday**. As of right now, the distribution of palms is permissible. How to carry that out safely is yet determined. The Celebration of Holy Thursday will be at 8:00 PM. There will be two Good Friday **Services**. The one in English is at 3:00 PM and the one in Vietnamese is at 8:00 PM. Easter Vigil, at present, is scheduled to begin at 8:00 PM. We are looking into the possibility of having an outdoor celebration. On Easter Sunday Morning, celebrations in English will be at 9:00 and in Vietnamese at 11:00.
